Supporting Adults for Inclusive Living (SAIL) is a program of the Southeastern Massachusetts Educational Collaborative that serves adults ages 22 and above. SAIL is designed to offer a broad range of specialized support services to facilitate the transition of young adults with developmental disabilities from school to work and from home to community. Individuals referred to SAIL have been identified as having service needs in one or more of the following areas: individual supports, employment supports and /or residential supports.
